SOMETIMES SQUARE BY ALAIN PAIEMENT AT THE MUSÉE D'ART CONTEMPORAIN STARTING OCTOBER 21

Montréal, October 13, 1994. As part of its Project Series, the Musée d'art contemporain de Montréal is presenting **SOMETIMES SQUARE** by Montréal artist Alain Paiement, from October 15 to December 4. This exhibition consists of an impressive series of photographic images captured in New York's Times Square, a site overflowing with visual, architectural and social information.

For more than 12 years now, Alain Paiement has explored the graphic depiction of specific places such as the *Clock Tower* in Old Montréal, the *Paris Stock Exchange* and the *New York Stock Exchange*. Working with painting, photography, sculpture and installation, he "reconstructs" these spaces by means of various technical processes like mapping and plandrawing.

From Waterdampstrukturen to Sometimes Square

In 1985, Paiement produced his *Waterdampstrukturen*. In this atmospheric installation, the artist employs photography and painting to construct a huge spiral referring to the ways clouds are formed. Closer to home, he focused on the Clock Tower, in Old Montréal. The resulting work, *Dead on Time* (1990-91), which is in the museum's collection, uses digitalized images to create a shell-shaped representation of time passing and stopping. More recently, in *Bourse de Paris* and *Bourse de New York* (1993-94), the world of these major financial markets becomes the subject of his videographic, photographic and theoretical investigation.

Curator Josée Bélisle observes that: "The artist cultivates numerous paradoxes [in Sometimes Square]: that of the specifically pictorial character of the dematerialized image; that of the monumental scale - for the spectator - of a model that is nonetheless considerably smaller than lifesize; that of the concrete and fabricated appearance of the formal values that support the torrent of mediatized impressions and messages..." The curator then concludes: "The fragmentary, crystallized representation of Times Square, developed and thrown together on a large scale, becomes the scene of a dialogue between traditional fine arts practices and the infinite possibilities, in this cybernetic age, of the computer-graphics image."

Meeting with Alain Paiement, October 19 at 6:30 p.m.

The artist will meet the public on Wednesday October 19 at 6:30 p.m., when he will discuss various aspects of his work. The meeting will take place in the *Banque Laurentienne Gallery*. At the front desk, please mention you are attending the activity *Meeting with Alain Paiement*.

A native of Montréal, Alain Paiement earned a bachelor's and a master's degree in visual arts from the Université du Québec à Montréal. He continued his training with a course in painting and photography at the École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Visuels de la Cambre, in Brussels, and studies in aesthetics at the Université de Paris I.

Alain Paiement has been a regular participant in exhibitions in Québec and elsewhere since the early eighties. His main solo exhibitions include:
